

Message from Pastor:

This month, we will celebrate two interesting Sundays of the church calendar: Pentecost and Trinity Sunday. I love these two days because they are so difficult to wrap our minds around. One Sunday a year, we are asked to consider either the Holy Spirit or the Trinity as a whole, two difficult and mysterious theological concepts which whole courses are taught on in seminary. I love them though because we have the opportunity to hear these stories and readings again and again, to revisit them every year and continue to grow in our questions and understandings.

On May 19th, we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost is always celebrated fifty days after Easter and remembers when the Holy Spirit came as rushing wind and tongue of fire in Acts 2. With the Hebrew word for Spirit also able to mean wind or breath, this rushing wind acts as an embodiment of the Spirit. Pentecost Sunday is a moment when we can marvel at the ways the Spirit has been active in the church in the past and the ways the Spirit is active in our lives today.

Trinity Sunday is always that next week, and is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar, having been instituted in the 1300's. On this day, we marvel at the wonder of our God who is three in one. We explore the ways God is revealed to us and sit in that which is holy and wholly mysterious.

In recognition of these two celebrations, I want to share a bit about how one theologian thinks about the Spirit. Elizabeth Johnson, a renowned Catholic theologian wrote about the Trinity in her book She Who Is. Johnson pulls on beautiful feminine imagery from the Bible to talk about the Trinity. She discussed how the Spirit is present whenever we feel there is more to the world, whether we are hoping and yearning for more or being held in the promise of what will come. Our very lives are dripping with the Spirit's involvement, from the wonder of the natural world, to personal and interpersonal relationships where we love and lose, to the institutions and structures that shape our lives.

We often forget about the Holy Spirit; we find ourselves a bit unsure of how to talk about her and how to relate to her. And yet, many of the times when we think of God generically, we are thinking of the work of the Spirit. When we ask God to guide us, to sustain us, to give us grace, we are reaching for the Spirit. When we look to the origins of the church in Acts or the Israelites' journey in the desert, "Biblical narratives of origin show that Christian Life is unthinkable apart from the presence and activity of the Spirit who animates and makes holy the church". It is God the Spirit who reaches for us and draws us into herself, enabling us to become the church and act in accordance with God's will.

This month, as we prepare for our Annual Congregational Meeting, the baptisms of Lane Hozier and Noah Ferreira-Strauss, Pentecost Sunday, Trinity Sunday, and the year ahead, may our eyes be opened to the working of the Spirit in our midst. May every breath we take and every breeze we feel be a reminder of God's presence in with and through us all.

The Holy Spirit is at work in, through, and with you, my friends. She is calling you ever closer to God and giving you strength for the days ahead. May we continue to walk by her guidance this day and every day.

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Here is an update on our March 2024 Financials:



As you can see above, our balance in our Parish decreased by (-\$6,101.54) over the month of March 2024. Thank you all for your generous contributions each month. Expenses are trending higher than our receipts this past month.

The First of Our Four Temple Talks – scheduled for April 14th, 2024, did not occur.

Therefore, I have included it in our May monthly Bethany Newsletter for your convenience.

"The Four Cs of Stewardship" is our theme this year for our Annual Stewardship Drive 2024-2025 (please see below).

"Commitment, Challenge, Compassion, Community"

The Call to Commitment:

- Commitment is not a mere obligation; it is a **calling.** Our commitment to God and his work is rooted in our love for Him. Just as God is faithful to us, we are called to be faithful in return.
- In 1 Corinthians 4:2, Paul reminds us, "Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful." Our commitment is an act of stewardship a faithful management of the gifts God has entrusted to us.

Dedication and Faithfulness:

- Commitment involves dedication. It is not about convenience; it is about devotion. We
 commit ourselves to regular worship, prayer, and service because we love God and
 desire to honor Him.
- Hebrews 10:25 encourages us: "Let us not neglect meeting together, as some have made a habit, but let us encourage one another."



Our Covenant with God:





April 21th – WELCA Temple Talk 2 - Stephanie Staudenmeyer


April 28th – Walt & Eleanor Mauroschadt will be received as new members.

Dear Friend,

You are receiving this letter because at some point you have been generous to Asbury's Good Neighbor Outreach to the Homeless. There is so much which I can share with you. First, this ministry found me and our Church – Asbury starts with an A, we are located on a busy highway, and we have gotten the reputation 'they will help you there.' And the rest, they say is history!

In 2023, we assisted 91 neighbors (including at least 24 children/dependents) and provided 737 days/nights of housing. The largest category of assisted neighbors can be described as elderly. Over \$46,000 was spent in this ministry!

Each time, there is a story behind the assistance given. . .

- Like the time the Cinnaminson Police called with a mother and son, a
 junior in a local high school and said they needed a place to stay due to
 just being evicted. Thankfully, a place in a local motel was provided. But
 then, down the road the mother's car was repossessed. Believe me, you
 never, ever want this to happen as it is a hard process to get the car back.
 Again, by the grace of God we were able to assist and get the car back so
 the mother could work. The happy ending to this story is that the mother
 and son were able to get back into their apartment just before Christmas!
- Just in the past month, a young father taking care of his 1-year-old son called needing assistance. This father, who is working a full-time job while his son is in day care, needed help with 3 days of assistance in a local

motel which Asbury's Good Neighbor was able to provide. Obviously, this young man and his son need `more than what we provided – i.e. more stable and permanent housing! Yet, seeing this need doesn't magically provide it! He had an emergency need, and by the grace of God, we were able to meet it.

- As noted above, the largest category of assistance provided is for the elderly. For many, motels are "low-income housing" which means partial stays during the month, often with very limited resources. Asbury's Good Neighbor helps fill the gaps and assists many whose income falls short of their basic needs.
- Just in the past few days, four calls for assistance have come in one for a seventy-year-old homeless man, another for a 59-year-old woman, another for a homeless mother, daughter and 4-year-old boy, and a family of three who are homeless. The needs are overwhelming!

Personally, I never get used to the needs that come to us. They are real and people are hurting. Some ask, shouldn't someone else be doing this? And that's why many choose not to be involved and as it is put in the Bible, 'they pass by on the other side.' By the grace of God, Asbury's Good Neighbor Outreach works with others in this ministry. Our guiding principle is "IT TAKES A VILLAGE" and we work together with Saint Vincent DePaul of Saint Charles Roman Catholic Church Cinnaminson, Calvary Church – Delran, and The Greater Triboro Clergy Association. We meet and share who we are assisting and pray that our help is helpful.

A quote by Father Greg Boyle of Homeboy Industries captures a great attitude in reaching out to the poor. "Here is what we seek: a compassion that can stand in awe at what the poor have to carry rather than stand in judgment how they carry it."

You have helped in the past and for that I say THANK YOU AND MAY GOD BLESS YOU! Currently, our funds to help are very low. Any assistance you would like to offer at the present time is most welcome.

Dear Robert,

I am writing to thank you and the Bethany Evangelical Lutheran Church for the generous \$1,000 donation, dated April 10, 2024, to Cathedral Kitchen. Your congregation's support is so helpful right now as we ended 2023 having served more free meals than in any year in CK's history, with the high demand continuing into 2024.

In 2023, we experienced a 39% increase in onsite meals served as compared to 2022. In addition, the number of families coming to CK for meals increased by 66% since 2022. Along with the increase in meals, we have also seen a rise in demand for the array of services provided in our Pavilion, such as case management, free groceries, and free hygiene items.

We just concluded our annual guest survey that took place throughout the month of March. Guests were asked at random to take a 20-minute survey, or a shorter 10-minute survey, and we gave them a gift card for their time. The surveys were anonymous and had questions related to demographics, housing, and services we offer. The results from this survey will give us a better understanding of our guests' needs and help us improve our meals and services.

In addition, we recently held a graduation ceremony and celebration for our 32nd Culinary Arts Training class. During the 15-week program, students learn safe food handling, hands-on cooking skills and important employability skills such as how to work in a team and communicate effectively on the job. Also, the entire class took and passed their ServSafe exam, which enables them to obtain an important food handling certification that culinary employers look for.

Thank you so much for investing in Cathedral Kitchen's mission to help people out of food insecurity and champion their pursuit of stability and prosperity. We could not do this without your support and the support of others.
