

## A Message From Our Pastor:

These are exciting times here at Bethany, full of opportunities for you to connect with the congregation, God, and yourself in new ways in the upcoming months. I wanted to take a moment this month to highlight a few of these opportunities for you.

We are beginning a once a month Sunday School! This group will be primarily geared towards elementary schoolers but toddlers are welcome to participate with their parents' help. We will meet after worship on the first Sunday of every month upstairs in the Sunday School Classroom. For the first month or two, I will be teaching but if you are interested in teaching, let me know. It is a great and rewarding way to engage with our youngest members. If you intend to come to Sunday School, please let me know so we can prepare appropriately.

Our congregational assembly is creeping up on us which means it's time to acknowledge those who have completed their terms on council and what spots will be opening. Emily Cheney and Peggy Schock will both be completing their second term and will need to step down. This means we will have two openings on council for the upcoming year. The work of our church council is critical to our mission at Bethany. I humbly ask you to consider whether serving on council is something you are called to do. We meet once a month on the second Tuesday at 7 PM. Meetings run between one and two hours and transportation can be arranged if driving at night is a challenge. Please reach out to our Council President, Rick Dreby, or myself if you are interested in serving on council.

In addition, Synod Assembly will be here before you know it. Once a year, representatives from every ELCA congregation in New Jersey gather to pray, worship, and complete the business of the synod. This year is an especially full year because we will be electing a new Bishop as Bishop Tracie Bartholomew ends her term and is not seeking reelection. The Synod Assembly will take place at Hilton East Brunswick Hotel (3 Tower Center Blvd, East Brunswick, NJ 08816) from June 5<sup>th</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup>. Expenses will be covered by the congregation. Our congregation can send two adult voting members and one youth/young adult member (30 and under) to the Assembly.

This event is a fantastic look into the work our congregation is a part of with the NJ Synod and the ELCA as a whole. During the assembly, you will hear from various task forces and teams within the synod, celebrate joys and acknowledge losses. I still remember attending my first synod assembly in Maryland when Bishop Bill Gohl was elected. I was blown away by the presence of so many Lutherans in the same place praying and discerning the future of the Synod together.

Voting members who will be attending the Synod Assembly are encouraged to attend our District meeting at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Magnolia on March 16<sup>th</sup> at 3 PM as well. We will be nominating folks to Synod council but our time will primarily be spent discussing in small groups, what people would expect of a new bishop or what they would desire of a new bishop. This is sure to be a fruitful preparation for our work at the assembly in June.

I hope you enjoyed the Christmas season and the services that we had at Bethany. The service were both well attended as we celebrated the birth of Jesus. Council would like to thank those that decorated the church for Christmas, it was beautiful.

Dear Friend of Asbury's Good Neighbor Outreach to the Homeless,

Each year, when I write the Church's Christmas letter, I often look for a compelling story to offer like this year when I found the story of the Kansas City Secret Santa. Google these four words and you will read a compelling story of kindness and generosity.

And yet, for Asbury's Good Neighbor Outreach to the Homeless moving stories have found us. . .

- Like the family of 6 with 4 children who spent the previous night in a local park sleeping outside. It was a Saturday evening when this need became known to us, and they were housed immediately and provided emergency food.
- The single mother of 2 with the children's ages 9 and 7 who left a message on the Church phone in October at 4:30 AM saying that she needed assistance. Turns out, she and her 2 children were living in their car during much of the past year. We were able to provide emergency housing, Walmart and Wawa gift cards, and gas for her car. This mother, is now in her 5th week of work, has come to worship with us, and with Asbury's help, the assistance of other ministries, and ultimately God's leading, is finding a way to a better life.
- The single mother of 4 who lost her job with children's ages 10,7,3 and 2 who called the Church and shared that she was facing eviction in her 3-bedroom apartment and needed \$6,000.00. The first thing we did was

pray and ask God for help! And then, latching onto one of the core truths in this ministry that "IT TAKES A VILLAGE", God used Asbury to help coordinate assistance from different groups – the Division of Child Protective Services, Saint Vincent DePaul of Saint Charles Borromeo Church of Cinnaminson, Calvary Church of Delran, and Senator Singleton's Office Head of Constituency Nisha Ray who connected us to Garden State Homes who helped pay the final balance. This mother was not evicted, has a new job, is current on her rent, and faces the future with hope in God. She has also come to Worship and found welcome and warm fellowship.

The 66-year-old woman facing disability who stays at a local motel. However, her Social Security income falls \$500.00 short each month to pay for her stay. When she first called the Church, her plan was to get a blanket to sleep in the Woods. We are assisting this dear child of God and are trying to find her decent, affordable housing.

November was a dramatic month. I could share with you numbers and costs. But instead I have felt God's leading to tell you the stories which I have shared with you. The most noteworthy categories of people we assist are single mothers with children and the elderly. The need is tremendous!



This ministry found us, and we are trying to be faithful to God who has called us to love our neighbors who are in need.
