Dear Robert,
I am writing to thank you and the Bethany Evangelical Lutheran Church for the generous $\$ 1,000$ donation, dated December 16, 2022, to Cathedral Kitchen. I appreciate the congregation's support this year more than ever due to the record setting demand for meals and services we are seeing at the same time as record high costs for everything from food to supplies.

We are as busy as ever at Cathedral Kitchen. After a year of effort, we were finally able to get the "Pavilion" installed in the parking lot. It is a very large shed with windows where we are housing services, such as free groceries and hygiene items, that are provided during the weekday meal. Because of the more hospitable way we set up the tables and chairs in the dining room, we no longer have enough space inside for partner organizations that provide services, such as medical and behavioral health care, to the meal guests. The Pavilion expands our "indoor" space so that guests that come to CK for 300 to 600 free, hot and nutritious meals per day can access services in an area protected from the elements.

In addition, two weeks ago we graduated our $28^{\text {th }}$ Culinary Arts Training Program class, with 20 students. We enjoyed watching the students learn and grow over the 15 weeks of the class. All of them passed the ServSafe exam, which enables them to be certified in safe food handling and makes graduates more marketable to employers in the culinary field. Already, a number of the graduates have jobs, and we are working with the rest to help them obtain employment.

Thank you and the congregation so much for supporting Cathedral Kitchen in our mission to help people out of food insecurity and champion their pursuit of stability and prosperity.
