

Message from Pastor Bre

Grace, peace, and comfort to you from God our parent, Christ our sibling, and the Holy Spirit our friend.

I pray that this holiday season has been kind to you and that you have had opportunities to feel God's presence with you. I also recognize that the holidays are a time when our loneliness or pain can be harder to ignore. Sometimes the only prayer we have left is begging for God to come.

1 O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence —
2 as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil —
to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence!
3 When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. (Isaiah 64:1-3 NRSV)

The prophet cried for God to come down, to be among us, to bring justice and peace. We cry out as well. We cry for God to come and restore justice and peace and love among all people. And instead of coming in power and glory, Christ came humbly as a child. Christ tore open the heavens and was born, in poverty and oppression. Christ the Word, who chose to enter into the messiness and pain of human life so none of us would be far from him.

14And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. 15(John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") 16From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. 17The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. 18No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known. (John 1:14-18 NRSV)

God, full of glory and power and grace and truth, came to us as the most vulnerable among us, an infant, who needs constant care and love. God tore open the heavens and came, not with war chariots and battle cries, but with sleepy cuddles and newborn screams. God loved us enough to allow us to care for and protect this tiny infant. The infant king who would one day show us his love in Jerusalem not in battle and political power but by dying on the cross and showing us that not even death has the last word. Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Not loneliness, not poverty, not suffering, not vulnerability, not power or principalities, not death. God has torn open the heavens and come. And this cannot be undone.

May you find peace and joy in the newborn Christ this season. May you be comforted that God is with us, now and forever.


Happy Holidays to all;

As you can see above, our balance in our Parish decreased by (-\$5,790.19) over the month of October. Thank you all for your generous contributions each month. Expenses are trending higher than our receipts this past month.




