

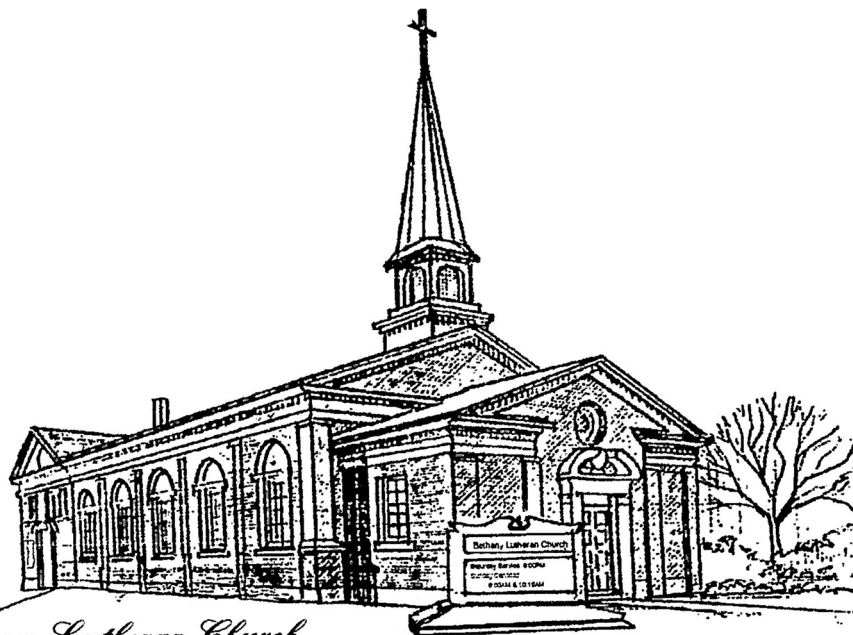

A Message From Our Pastor:

Beloved people of Bethany,

Summer is here, bringing with it the desire for less structure, more rest, and the joy of vacations and day trips. As June, July, and August unfold, many of us step out of our usual routines. I'm certainly not one to discourage that; time spent outside, resting and recharging in God's beautiful creation, is one of my favorite parts of the season. Summer also gives us unique opportunities to notice God's presence in new ways and to nurture our faith in simple, steady rhythms.

As we enter this season, we also enter what the church calls "Ordinary Time." This is the part of the church year not marked by festivals or special seasons, but by ordinal numbers – first, second, third, and so on– which simply count the Sundays. The color for this season is green, reminding us of growing things. And that is the heart of Ordinary Time: the slow, steady, faithful growth of our life with God.

As our schedules shift, I invite you to consider how you might support your faith during these months. If you're traveling and away from church on a Sunday, you might worship with us online or visit a congregation wherever you are. You could begin a simple devotional practice, try a new prayer routine, or pick up a book that helps you explore your faith more deeply. If weekends are full but your weekdays have more space, perhaps this is a good time to volunteer with a ministry or committee that speaks to your gifts.

There are so many ways to use this season to nurture your faith and deepen your roots in this community. If you'd like to talk through ideas or explore what might fit your life right now, I would love to hear from you.

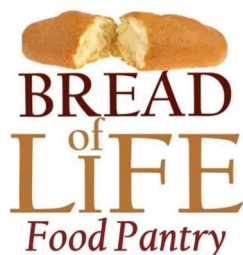
Council Meeting Summary

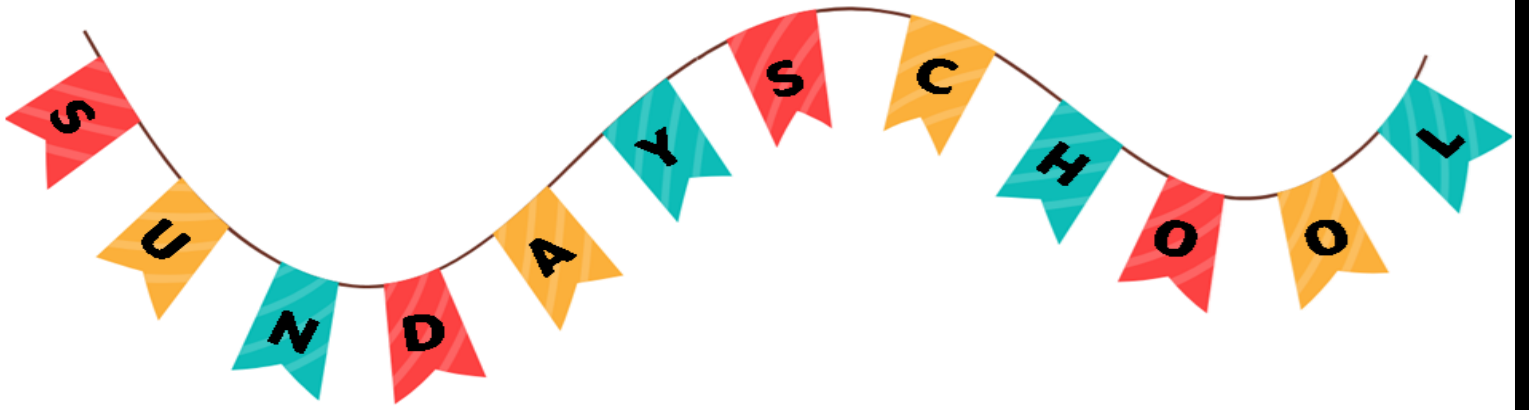
Coming up in June/July/August:
