Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near!

1 In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, 2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." 3 This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'"

⁴ Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 5 Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, 6 and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

Repentance is one of those things that we are fine talking about in the abstract but don't much like to confront when it becomes personal and messy. Every Sunday morning, we begin our worship service with the order of Confession and Forgiveness of Sins. A time when we come together and proclaim to God that we have failed. That we have actively chosen to sin. That we repent.

But sometimes we need to ask ourselves, have we truly repented? Are we truly sorry?

I worked in a childcare facility for a number of years and whenever one child hit another, we always marched them over to the other and made them say sorry. But to be sorry, to repent, requires us to change our behavior. Very young children aren't truly apologizing when we ask them to say sorry after hitting someone, it's not developmentally appropriate for them to be able to understand and change their behavior right away. We have them say sorry to train them in repentance, train them in how to acknowledge when you mess up and how to make amends.

Confession and Forgiveness on Sunday can serve in this same way. It helps us practice how to repent. How to see when we fail and choose to behave differently. It teaches us to be honest when we fail, in "things we have done and in things we have failed to do." To hold ourselves accountable by being in community. To do our best every day, knowing we will likely mess up and that there is always another chance to try again.

May we indeed be "truly sorry and humbly repent" when we fail to live as God has called us to live. When we harm another through our actions or apathy. When we prioritize ourselves over our neighbors. When we fail to trust God and place our trust in money, power, or people instead.

John the Baptist cried out in the wilderness to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." Repent. Change your ways. Join in the good things God is doing. Forgiveness is waiting. Amen.
